

## Ribbon Star Block

Use red white and blues

4 – 4.5 inch white squares

8 - 2.5 inch white squares

2 - 2.5 inch x 6.5 red rectangles (one each of fabrics 1 and 2)

- 2.5 inch x 4.5 inch red rectangles (one each of fabrics 1 and 2)

2 - 2.5 x 4.5 blue rectangles (one each of fabrics 3 and 4)

2 – 2.5 x 6.5 blue rectangles (one each of fabrics 3 and 4)

1. Mark a diagonal line from corner to corner on each 2.5 inch square.
2. Lay a 2.5 inch square on top of each of the 6.5 inch rectangles with the diagonal line lying from top left to lower right and stitch on the diagonal line ... trim  $\frac{1}{4}$  inch from stitching and press seam. = part A
3. Lay a 2.5 inch square on top of each of the 4.5 inch rectangles with the diagonal line lying from top right to lower left and stitch on diagonal line ... trim  $\frac{1}{4}$  inch from stitching and press seam. = part B
4. Lay a part B on top of each of the 4.5 inch squares matching left edge (triangle toward the top) ... stitch a  $\frac{1}{4}$  inch seam along left edge and press seam toward the rectangle = Part C
5. Lay Part C color 1 right side up on table with the colored rectangle toward the bottom. Lay Part A color 3 along right side of part C (triangle toward the top) matching edges then stitch a  $\frac{1}{4}$  inch seam along the right edge ... press seam toward the rectangle. = Part D. repeat with color 2 part C and color 1 part A, then color 3 part C and color 4 part A, then color 4 part C and color 2.
6. Following the above pattern will make it look like woven ribbon once you are finished.
7. Lay part D (colors 1 and 3) face up with 4.5 inch square on the upper left side. Lay a second part D (colors 2 and 1) face down with the 4.5 inch square also on the upper left side ... stitch along the right side. Press seam. Part E.
8. Repeat step 6 with remaining part Ds. (Part D colors 4 and 2 face up and Part D color 3 and 4)
9. 8. Lay one Part E face up with the 4.5 inch squares toward the left. Lay second Part E face down (with the squares also to the left) Stitch a  $\frac{1}{4}$  inch seam along the right side. Press. Voila!
