We will be providing more information during the monthly guild meetings or the newsletter.



Challenge Quilts

The theme for our 2026 challenge is <u>"Making a Grand Entrance".</u> Your design can be anything that is your interpretation of the theme. Use your imagination and have fun. We encourage everyone in the guild to participate in this challenge.

QUILTS ENTERED IN THE CHALLENGE WILL BE DISPLAYED AT OUR SEPTEMBER 2026 QUILT SHOW!!

- #1 RULE: HAVE FUN!!! Use your imagination! Your creation can be traditional or contemporary.
- REQUIRED! Your challenge must be in the shape of a rectangle measuring 20" by 24 inches. Your challenge must be a "quilt"... 3 layers including front, back and batting and quilted. Your rectangle can be either vertical or horizontal. Make sure any embellishments you add won't droop when we hang your challenges. Also make sure your sleeve is on the correct edge on the back so we know which end is up for hanging.
- <u>Methods of Construction:</u> You are free to use whatever construction, or quilting methods work best for your creation (i.e., machine pieced, hand pieced, paper pieced, machine appliqued, hand appliqued, machine or hand quilted, etc.). We encourage you to challenge yourself and be creative.
- <u>Fabric Requirement:</u> You can use whatever fabrics you want in your challenge. Your fabrics do not all have to be 100% cotton. Embellishments are optional.
- Hanging Sleeve and Label: The quilt back must have a hanging sleeve. Make sure you put a label with your name on the back of your challenge. Give credit to the source that inspired you. Please cover up your label with a piece of paper, fabric or tape before handing it in for voting at our guild meeting so it's a secret as to who made it.
- <u>Due Date:</u> Finished challenges are due at our September 2026 guild meeting for judging by your quilt guild peers and subsequently will be hung at our September 2026 quilt show for attendees to vote on their favorite. All guild members attending the September 2026 meeting will have the opportunity to vote anonymously for their favorite challenge quilt. Ribbons will be awarded for guild favorite, and the top favorites of show viewers.



Our History

HERRING RUN QUILTER'S GUILD HISTORY

25 Years Ago - From the September 2000 Newsletter

In 2000, Guild dues were \$15, and we had \$3091.25 in the Treasury as of April 30th. The theme of the 2000 quilt show was "Quilts...Our Heritage. A journey through the timeless treasures of quilt making." The venue was Hanover High School, and admission was \$4.00. The 2000 Challenge theme was "The Seasons Sewn, A Year in Patchwork", and three challenge fabrics were required to be used. "Millennium Star" was the name of the raffle quilt.

2000 Fall programs that were announced included presentations/workshops by Ruth McDowell, Mary K Ryan, and Robin Storesund. A field trip to Maine was announced for October. The trip included quilt shops, Portland Head Light, and outlet shopping.

Digitizing Records – Update

We are still scanning the copies of Guild Newsletters that are available in the paper records. So far, we have scanned Newsletters from the years 1989 through June 2004, and 2011 through 2013. We have 2014-2016 left to scan. As you can see, we currently have a significant gap in our information.
