Workshop: Taking the Challenge Out of Sewing Curved Blocks

Instructor: Mary Cannizzaro

Workshop Focus: Curved Piecing Technique Class

Mary has designed a special wallhanging size quilt for this session. Mary will teach two different techniques to make the orange peel as well as the circles involved. Techniques will be taught in class and students can create wallhanging in their own time.

Blocks are 6" finished and 3 x 6" finished. Three separate units will be created with joining pieces. Mary's original sketch and her version in grunge fabrics.

7. Flowers by Fat Quarter Shop



Fat Quarter Flowers Quilt



Copie Rogaremento

Ten Fat Quarters or 18" x 20" rectangles 2 1/2 yards background fabric % yard binding fabric

3 % yards backing fabric 2 rolls 7" Half Square Triangle Paper - Triangles on a Holl #1000

cutting

Cut each 18" x 20" rectangle into: 2 - 8 1/s" x 16 1/s" rectangles - 20 total (Fabric A)

Cut background fabric into: 20 - 8 ½" x 16 ½" rectangles (Fabric 8)

Cut binding fabric into: 7 - 2 1%" a width of fabric strips (Fabric C) Cut 7" Half Square Triangle Paper into: 20 - one by two sections (2 squares each)



the M' seams and press as arrows indicate throughout. REDCY: ASSOCIATE.

With right sides facing, layer a Fabric A rectangle with a Fabric II rectangle.

Place a one by two section of 7" Triangles on a Roll on top and pin in place.

Set stitch length to 1.5 and sew on the dotted lines. Cut apart on the solid lines.

Half Square Triangle Unit should measure 7 1/2" x 7 1/2".

Make eighty

Cut each Half Square Triangle Unit in half vertically. Print Rectangle Unit and Background Rectangle Unit should measure 3 %" x 7 ½".











Assemble one Background Rectangle Unit and one different Print Rectangle Unit. Partial Petal Unit should measure 7" x 7 %".

Challenge Quilts

Every other year, to coincide with our bi-annual quilt show, HRQG offers a challenge to our quilters. A theme is provided, along with a specific size, then members unleash their creativity! Challenge quilts are presented at the September 2026 monthly Guild meeting, where they are judged by 100+ members of the guild. Next, they travel to the bi-annual quilt show, where they are shared with the public!

The theme for our 2026 challenge is <u>"Making a Grand Entrance".</u> Your design can be anything that is your interpretation of the theme. Use your imagination and have fun. We encourage everyone in the guild to participate in this challenge.

QUILTS ENTERED IN THE CHALLENGE WILL BE DISPLAYED AT OUR SEPTEMBER 2026 QUILT SHOW!

- #1 RULE: HAVE FUN! Use your imagination! Your creation can be traditional or contemporary.
- REQUIRED! Your challenge must be in the shape of a rectangle measuring 20" by 24 inches. Your challenge must be a "quilt"... 3 layers including front, back and batting and quilted. Your rectangle can be either vertical or horizontal. Make sure any embellishments you add won't droop when we hang your challenges. Also make sure your sleeve is on the correct edge on the back so we know which end is up for hanging.
- <u>Methods of Construction:</u> You are free to use whatever construction, or quilting methods work best for your creation (i.e., machine pieced, hand pieced, paper pieced, machine appliqued, hand appliqued, machine or hand quilted, etc.). We encourage you to challenge yourself and be creative.
- **Fabric Requirement:** You can use whatever fabrics you want in your challenge. Your fabrics do not all have to be 100% cotton. Embellishments are optional.
- Hanging Sleeve and Label: The quilt back must have a hanging sleeve. Make sure you put a label with your name on the back of your challenge. Give credit to the source that inspired you. Please cover up your label with a piece of paper, fabric or tape before handing it in for voting at our guild meeting so it's a secret as to who made it.
- <u>Due Date:</u> Finished challenges are due at our September 2026 guild meeting for judging by your quilt guild peers and subsequently will be hung at our September 2026 quilt show for attendees to vote on their favorite. All guild members attending the September 2026 meeting will have the opportunity to vote anonymously for their favorite challenge quilt. Ribbons will be awarded for guild favorites, and the top favorites of show viewers. If you have any questions about the challenge, please contact Mary Ann Karpinski.
